Gruelling journey on skis for cancer

GLENN Geary stepped it up a gear in a bid to support the Hunter Medical Research Institute yesterday, saying a donation was simply not enough.

The face of The Good Guys at Kotara stuck it out on water skis for more than two hours between Manly and Newcastle Harbour to raise funds for research into the most common type of childhood cancer, acute lymphoblastic leukaemia.

"I wanted to try and do something to give back to the community but rather than give a cash donation I wanted to get involved," Mr Geary said.
